49 would-be immigrants arrested off Mostaganem

MOSTAGANEM - Coastguard units foiled, on Thursday night, off the coast of Mostaganem several attempts of illegal migration and arrested 49 individuals, including foreigners, said this security body.

During patrols conducted between 10.00 p.m. and 3.00 a.m., the coastguards intercepted, in the north of the commercial port of Mostaganem and off the east cost of the province, three groups of would-be immigrants in makeshift boats, said the source.

The arrested people, including 3 foreigners, 4 minors and a woman were taken to the province's commercial port where units of the Civil Protection took charge of them.

They will be delivered to the competent security services and will be then brought to court, added the source.

Chenine emphasizes Algeria's role in peace, security in Africa

ALGIERS - Chairman of the People's National Assembly (Lower House) Slimane Chenine on Thursday emphasized Algeria's efficient role in the establishment of peace and security in Africa, the promotion of a joint action and the peaceful resolution of conflicts under full respect for the sovereignty and territorial integrity of States.

Speaking at ahead of the 5th Summit of Parliamentarians, Chenine referred to "the efficient role Algeria plays in the establishment of peace and security in Africa, the promotion of a joint African action and the settlement of conflicts through peaceful means under full respect for the sovereignty of States and their territorial integrity while favouring national dialogue that leads to consensus, with neither violence nor exclusion."

Algeria is equidistant vis-à-vis all Libyan parities and seeks to help them to find solutions to the crisis by peaceful means, with neither violence nor foreign interference, and to preserve the country's territorial and social unity," said the Lower House speaker.

"In addition, Algeria supports the right of the Palestinian people to an independent State with Al-Quds as capital city, in accordance with the resolutions adopted by the United Nations," he continued. Chenine also referred to Algeria's approach in strengthening "human solidarity and development in African countries."

The creation of the Algerian Agency for International Cooperation, initiated by President of the Republic Abdelmadjid Tebboune, aims at "establishing an international cooperation likely to help African brothers to enhance their material and human capacities," recalled the same official.

Football - CAN 2021: Qualifiers to resume in November

CAIRO - The qualifiers of the African Cup of Nations (CAN-2021), suspended due to the new coronavirus pandemic (Covid-19), will resume in next November with the organization of the third and fourth Days, announced Wednesday the Confederation of African Football (CAF) on its official website.

The CAF Emergency Committee has also approved the resumption date for qualifiers of the Total Africa Cup of Nations Cameroon 2021 and the group stage of the FIFA World Cup Qatar 2022.

"A busy schedule awaits the participating teams with double-headers from November 2020 through to November 2021 in the battle for spots to the final tournament of the two competitions," CAF said.

"For Cameroon 2021, the qualifiers resume on 9-17 November 2020 with the Day 3 and 4 matches whilst the penultimate and ultimate matches take place on 22-30 March 2021," said the source.
